



### INTRODUCTION

On behalf of the Organizing Committee, we have the honour to welcome you as participants of the 10th International Congress on Catalysis in Hungary, a country now, two years after the change of regime, the 24th Member of the European Community and Associate Member of the European Community. After previous congresses held at four-year intervals in various parts of the world, in Philadelphia (1956), Paris, Amsterdam, Moscow, Palm Beach, London, Tokyo, Berlin and Calgary, it is now our great privilege to organize the ICC first time in Budapest. You will see Budapest in summer although many of you may have been acquainted with our capital through some scientific and other cultural events. The Organizing Committee hopes your stay in Hungary will be enjoyable and you will have a chance to see the sights of our lovely capital and some spots of interest in the countryside as well.

International Congresses on Catalysis have always given special emphasis to heterogeneous catalysis. The programme of the 10th International Congress on Catalysis will focus on New Frontiers in Catalysis including "nontraditional" catalytic materials and environmental catalytic problems. The contributions cover a wide range of fundamental, applied, industrial and engineering aspects of catalysis. The extending range and high efficiency of industrial techniques for observing catalytically important surfaces are also evident in the programme.

The Organizing Committee decided to follow the tradition of previous Congresses to arrange no more than two parallel sessions. We have increased the number of posters somewhat to accommodate a total of about 470 papers from 38 countries. Even so, this required sometimes painful decisions in choosing from the 764 abstracts submitted. The Organizing Committee is most grateful to the Members of the Paper Selection Committee and to the panel of referees who helped to make these choices.

Assistance in meeting the expenses of the Congress has come from a number of sources to whom the Committee is most grateful.

Valuable assistance with local arrangements has been provided by a number of persons in the catalysis and engineering community in Budapest and at major Hungarian Universities and Chemical Companies. Although having been sometimes only peripherally interested in catalysis, they have been eager to ensure the success of this important gathering in Budapest.

The layout of the Budapest Convention Centre seemed particularly well suited to an accompanying exhibition which is being included in the 10th ICC.

We hope that you find the scientific programme outstanding, the excellent social events rewarding and Budapest will provide beautiful and fascinating environment for your stay. We are pleased to have the opportunity to host the 10th International Congress on Catalysis and our Committee sincerely hopes that you will be able to attend. We will make every effort to make your sojourn in Hungary pleasant and memorable.


